

# A Review of Evidence-Based Interventions for Families Served by Infant-Toddler Court Teams

The Quality Improvement Center for Research-Based Infant-Toddler Court Teams (QIC-CT) conducted a review of evidence-based and evidence-informed practices for infants, toddlers, and families in the child welfare system. The goal of this research is to help child welfare systems and agencies increase their capacity to incorporate evidence-based practices to strengthen parenting and promote healthy development for very young children and families involved in child welfare. Conducted in early 2015, the QIC-CT's review of evidence-based and evidence-informed practices represents only those interventions from five selected registries that included children from birth to 3 years old in the target population.

The following point-in-time educational tool provides information to support stakeholders in identifying evidence-based and evidence-informed interventions to be implemented in their communities and for infant-toddler court team replication. As this information is constantly changing as new interventions are added to registries and new research is conducted, the QIC-CT plans to update this tool on an annual basis.

To guide stakeholders in using this tool, the QIC-CT has developed a resource that provides a detailed description of how the review of evidence-based and evidence-informed interventions was conducted and presents a decision-making framework comprised of important elements to consider when assessing an intervention's relevance for a community's infant and toddler population in child welfare.
